Teaching is the best profession, and I have always been a teacher. I graduated from Big Creek High School (highlighted in the movie October Sky) and couldn't forget my wonderful teachers from elementary, junior high, and high school. After graduating from Bluefield College with a BA in English and a mathematics minor, I taught mathematics in middle school for 16 years in McDowell County, West Virginia. In the summers, I worked providing professional development throughout West Virginia with teams from the West Virginia Department of Education.

When I moved to Mercer County, West Virgina, I worked for a textbook resource company... Eventually I went to Virginia Tech to work on my doctorate degree, and when I finished, I became a full time assistant professor at Bluefield College. When Dr. Clay retired, I became the director and then the Dean of the School of Education when we established the Master of Arts in Education, adding an online degree to our traditional teacher education program.

In the summer of 2017, I moved to Bristol, TN, and accepted the position to become the Dean of the School of Education. Teaching new teachers and guiding the School of Education provide challenges and always daily joy. (cont'd Pg. 3)
