January blitz was again good with a number of members renewing. Dues were just \$20 until February11, now \$25. We finished the 2019 year with 57 members.





Her full-length poetry collection, *The Mad Farmer's Wife*, was published in 2016 and was a finalist for the Weatherford Award in Appalachian Literature from Berea College. Her novel *Hiding Ezra*, released by Little Creek Books, was a finalist for the 2005 DANA Awards. She received three Pushcart nominations, and a Best of the Net nomination in 2012. Kari Kilgore released Fantastic Shorts: Volume 2 in January of 2020. This short story collection includes her modern myth The Spider Who Ate the Elephant, winner of 2nd place in Fiction for the 2019 Virginia Writers Club Golden Nib contest. It also includes two Appalachian tales. Odds and Endings introduces the fictional town of Lightning Gap, Virginia, and its magical bookstore. Several more Lightning Gap stories are on the way, especially in the Romance genre. The second is The Earworms, about an entire town infested with those songs that get stuck in your head and drive you crazy. It's set in Kari's hometown of St. Paul, very thinly disguised as Estonoa, Virginia.
