Speaker

Dr. Thomas Keats McKnight has forty-eight years in the teaching profession. He has taught Music, Early Childhood Development and Writing to students from five to ninety-five years old. He proudest accomplishment in his teaching career is a twenty-year writing project with senior writers from southwest Virginia. His students' writing has won awards from Virginia Tech, the Commonwealth of Virginia, the Virginia Community College System and Harvard University. Students in Dr. McKnight's Appalachian Writing Project have contributed stories, poems and essays to stage and radio plays that have been produced throughout Virginia and Kentucky.

His personal writing has deep roots in the Appalachian region, beginning in Harlan County, Kentucky. Much of Dr. McKnight's subject matter for his short stories, poetry, essays and educational writing includes voices of Appalachia's people, folklore, medicine, history and music. Dr. McKnight's first publications in Appalachian journals were at age thirteen. At that age, he started teaching composition to children in grades one through five. That was when teaching and writing became passions.

In semi-retirement, Dr. McKnight now resides in Sevierville, Tennessee, with his wife of forty-four years, Judy Ruth (Couch) McKnight.
