Speaker



Joe Tennis is a longtime collector of the folklore and history of Virginia, Tennessee, and North Carolina. He grew up in Virginia Beach, Virginia, and moved to Southwest Virginia in 1993, close to where he has family roots stemming from the late 1700s in East Tennessee. He is a former resident of Kingsport, Tennessee, and has spoken at libraries, schools, clubs, and historical societies. He has also appeared at paranormal conferences in Roanoke, Virginia, and Lynchburg, Virginia.

The Radford University graduate has contributed articles and photos on ghosts and legends to Blue Ridge Country, Bristol Herald Courier, Virginia Living, Hampton Roads Magazine, The Roanoke Times, and Appalachian Voice. He has also written for The Virginian-Pilot, Kingsport Times-News, Washington County News, Coastal Virginia Magazine, and Carolina Mountain Life.

Tennis has released three books featuring ghost tales: The Marble and Other Ghost Tales of Tennessee and Virginia, Haunts of Virginia's Blue Ridge Highlands, and Along Virginia's Route 58: True Tales from Beach to Bluegrass. The author's history books include Virginia Rail Trails: Crossing the Commonwealth; Washington County, Virginia: Then & Now; Sullivan County, Tennessee: Images of America; and Southwest Virginia Crossroads: An Almanac of Place Names and

Hello AAG,




