We will continue our bimonthly meetings in March, May, July, September, and November with our guest speakers. For the other months, we will be having special workshops geared to helping you as writers with topics like self-publishing vs other publishing methods, writing dialogue, writing memoirs, learning to critique, and writing prompts to get the juices flowing. If you have other topics of interest to you, please email those to me. I will include as many as possible for 2018. I hope you will plan to come to these meetings since they are for you. They will probably be at the Virginia Highlands Small Business Incubator conference room but more will follow about the details. They will be from 1-3 pm. I realize some of you work and cannot attend during the day but there is not a good time for everyone so we decided to go with the majority of the ones that had said they would attend.

Virginia Highlands Festival changes: To secure a table, you must register by February 1st. I know this is a long way off from the end of July when it takes place. However, to be able to register with VHF, we have to receive the money in order to pay them for our space. It is due the second week of February. Moving back to the Barter Green this year had its pros and cons. The biggest pro was a great number of books were sold. This continues to be a good event for AAG so hopefully all will continue to take part. If registering by February 1st, the table fee will remain at \$25 per day. You will be able to register/pay on the website if you choose or you can send your check to AAG PO Box 803 Abingdon, VA 24212 (postmarked February 1st). If spaces remain, we will accept registration closer to the event but the price per day per table will be \$40. We hope this is an incentive to have registrations by the deadline so we can be assured of having the funds needed to reserve our space. If paying on the website, you will need to email Linda Hoagland (lhhoagland@gmail.com) with your preferred days. Unless notified differently, the festival is scheduled for Friday, July 27th- Sunday, August 5th. That decision is still pending approval of the VHF committee and could be subject to change to Friday, August 3rd-Sunday, August 12th. We should know that by the time I send the January updates to you.

As always, thank you for supporting AAG. I hope you have enjoyed the year and all we have done to make this writing group the best it can be for the wonderful writers we have as members. Let's work together to make 2018 an even better year.
