Rita Quillen's new full-length poetry collection, THE MAD FARMER'S WIFE, is from Texas Review Press, a member of the Texas A&M Consortium of Presses. Her novel HIDING EZRA, published in March 2014 by Little Creek Books and was a finalist in the 2005 DANA Awards competition. A chapter of the book is included in the scholarly study of Appalachian dialect, TALKING APPALACHIAN, published by the University of Kentucky Press. She has served on staff for many creative writing workshops across the South and as a visiting writer at many high schools and colleges, including Bluefield College, Roanoke College, and University of the Cumberlands. One of six semi-finalists for the 2012-14 Poet Laureate of Virginia, she received a Pushcart nomination in both 2012 and 2015 and a Best of the Net nomination in 2012. Her previous poetry collections are COUNTING THE SUMS and HER SECRET DREAM, which received the Book of the Year award from the Appalachian Writers Association. Currently, she's working on turning her poems into songs.

Rita Quillen's novel Hiding Ezra was released by Little Creek Books. It, and a chapter of the novel is included in the new scholarly study of Appalachian dialect just published by the University of Kentucky Press entitled Talking Appalachian.
